

**HEALTH CONDITIONS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF LIVE BREEDING PIGS INTO THE
STATE OF SARAWAK, MALAYSIA
(Effective from 2nd May 2019)**

1. This licence is issued subjected to the consignment of livestock mentioned above accompanied by a valid certificate from a Government Veterinary Authority from the country of origin that the livestock exported are free diseases of an infectious or contagious nature.
2. At the time of importation this permit together with a Veterinary Health Certificate should be produced for inspection. Failure to produce these documents will result in permission being refused to land the animals.
3. Veterinary Certification:
 - 3.1 The country must be certified free from
 - (a) Foot and Mouth Disease
 - (b) African Swine Fever
 - (c) Classical Swine Fever
 - (d) Rinderpest
 - 3.2 Animals must be derived from farms clinically free from
 - (a) Transmissible Gastroenteritis (TGE)
 - (b) Tesched Disease (polioencephalomyelitis)
 - (c) Swine Vesicular Disease
 - (d) Vesicular Stomatitis
 - (e) Swine Influenza
 - (f) Post Weaning Multisystemic Wasting Syndrome (PMWS)
 - (g) Rabies
 - (h) Swine Parvovirus
 - (i) Atrophic Rhinitis
 - (j) Aujeszky's Disease
 - (k) Brucellosis Suis
 - 3.3 Within thirty (30) days of export, the animal must be submitted to the following tests with negative result:
 - (a) Brucellosis (Brucella Suis) (CSF or SAT)
 - (b) Leptospirosis (MAT) of less than 1/100 or farm certified free of leptospirosis serotype ponoma, tarasovi (hypos), canicola and icterohaemorrhagic; (Not required if Certification Statement Number 3.3.d can be made)
 - (c) Porcine Respiratory and Reproductive Syndrome virus (PRRS)
 - (d) the animals have been treated with dihydrostreptomycin at a dose rate of 25mg/kg bodyweight within seven days of export or treated twice with long-acting oxytetracycline at a rate of 20mg/kg at an interval of 14 days with the last treatment seven days before the export.
 - (e) A health certificate signed by a Government Veterinary Officer certifying that he/she had examined the animals prior to export and found them to be healthy and free from any clinical symptom of infectious or contagious diseases at the time of export

4. The animals must be identified with permanent identification using tattoo or ear-tagged.
5. Animals should be carried by ship/aircraft or sealed trucks direct to the prescribed landing place or port and may subject to transshipment as directed by State Veterinary Authority, Sarawak.
