

Livestock Farming Licence

Other Conditions (Layer,Broiler,Pullet,Breeder farm and Hatchery)

1. Discharges of livestock wastes or disposal of any untreated waste or pollutant in any manner, into or onto any watercourse, land situated outside the boundaries of the poultry farm, public road or surrounding environment are prohibited.
2. Infestation of flies should be kept to a minimum by the use of larvicides, lime powder and insecticide. Faeces should be kept dry and treated appropriately to reduce odour and flies
3. Bird carcasses and other wastes including hatchery waste are to be disposed of properly, either by burying, burning in incinerators.
4. Bird carcasses should not be fed to fish.
5. Malodour should be kept to a minimum.
6. Any marked increase in the number of poultry from the present population must obtain approval from State Veterinary Authority or his representative.
7. Application for renewal of this licence should be made 2 months before the expiry of this licence, failing which the licence is liable to be fined.
8. This licence is revocable under the Veterinary Public Health (Control of Livestock Farming) Rules Part II No.6

Display of Licence

This Licence is to be displayed at a conspicuous place in the Livestock farm.

Livestock Farming Licence

Other Conditions (Pig Farm)

1. Discharges of pig wastes or disposal of any untreated waste or pollutant in any manner, into or onto any watercourse, land situated outside the boundaries of the pig farm, public road or surrounding environment are prohibited.
2. Waste water treatment system capable of treating wastes to the standard required in law, should be installed within 4 months from the date of issuance of this licence.
3. Pig carcasses and other wastes are to be disposed off in an appropriate manner.
4. Malodour should be kept to a minimum.
5. Pig pens should always be clean, dry and free from diseases and flies by applying disinfectant, antiseptic or insecticide.
6. The owner must submit two reports for each year (a first half - yearly report and second half - yearly report) in accordance with section 44 of the Veterinary Public Health.
7. Application for renewal of this licence should be made 2 months before the expiry of this licence, failing which the licence is liable to be fined.
8. This licence is revocable under Section 44- 6(b) of the Veterinary Public Health Ordinance, 1999 (Control of Livestock Farming) should the owner breach the conditions or caused pollution to any watercourse.
9. The farm in Kuching, Samarahan and Serian division is required to be moved to the Pig Farming Area (PFA) Simunjan unless the owner has obtained approval to set up a modern pig farm from the State Planning Authority.
10. The Licence is required to submit quarterly information as per form attached to the nearest Veterinary Office.

Display Of Licence

This Licence is to be displayed at a conspicuous place in the livestock farm.
